I'm pleased to say that our two new Chinese books, Self-awareness and Marriage Enrichment, published in April and September respectively, have been very useful tools to our Family Life educators in conducting their courses. Two of our Family Life educators in Pingtan and Fuzhou conducted the Self-awareness course for Fuzhou University students. All the pre-believers in their classes came to know the Lord at the end of the course and others commented that this course is indeed relevant to all students in their university. Four of the workshop leaders expressed interest to be trained and to work full time to promote the course in their campus.

New co-worker in China: A church elder in Hangzhou had successfully organized two Marriage Enrichment camps within the year. She was touched at seeing many unbelieving husbands receive Jesus as their personal savior and the Lord of their marriages, and others tearfully recommit their lives to rebuild their marriages at the end of each camp.

In October this year, she resigned from her full-time church ministry in order to devote herself to work as our full-time staff in China. She will follow up the campers by forming and supervising the covenant family groups to ensure that they will integrate what they have learnt into their marriages and family lives. She will also recruit suitable candidates for the Family Life Educators Training Course. We pray that God will use her mightily to monitor the development of our ministry there.

The feedback from our parenting course at a Watchman Nee's house church moved the church leader to declare that there should be no denominational boundaries for family life education and he would like to send candidates to join our Family Life Educators Training Course.

In May 2013, we conducted a full-day Family Life Education seminar for the workers of a factory. In September of the same year, the owner of the factory shared with us that the Lord had spoken to him through III John 5-8, to support our ministry in China. He then indicated that he would like to dedicate a big room above his newly purchased coffee house for us to conduct our courses and to store the course materials. These heartening experiences seemed to confirm that God is opening a new way for Oasis to do something more than what we have been doing in China.

Though much time was spent in writing the two books, we have also been traveling quite extensively (China, Malaysia, Indonesia and Myanmar) to conduct the family wellness programs. The more we traveled, the greater the challenges we encountered for our mission, especially in

China. Though China has risen to be a wealthy and powerful nation in the world, her family life, which is the foundation of a nation's well-being, is eroding.

According to a reliable source, the divorce rate has risen drastically since 1980. In 1980, there were 341,000 marriage breakups. This number has more than doubled after 10 years, to 800,000 in 1990, and in 2000, it had risen to 1,210,000. In 2009 there were 1,713,000 divorces and today in average there are about 10,000 marriages breaking up daily.



Sexual immorality

Sex is God's special gift to humankind, not only for procreation but also for enhancing the spiritual and physical intimacy of a married couple. That is why Jesus said, "What God has joined together, let man not separate....Anyone who divorces his wife, except for marital unfaithfulness, and marries another woman, commits adultery." (Matt. 19:6&9). In other words, adultery breaks the spiritual bond of a couple. Thus Jesus regarded it as the only reason for divorce. A man may be registered as a legal husband to a woman but they become one only after they have consummation. This shows that sexual intimacy is the key to joining a man and a woman. On the contrary, if one party commits adultery, the marriage and family system of the person breaks down spiritually and physically. The party who breaks it has to be accountable to God, "for God will judge the adulterer and all the sexually immoral." (Heb.13:4)

If a person divorces his/her spouse legally but neither one of them has sexual relation with another person, the marriage cannot be regarded as broken. The spiritual bond between the divorced couple still exists. They should seek help for reconciliation. If any one of them gets married to another person or has sexual relation with another person, then he/she has committed adultery. The spiritual bond of the marriage is then broken.

In view of this, adultery truly is sinning against the person's own body as it hurts his/her spouse who is one flesh with him/her. For the Scripture says, "All other sins a man commits are outside his body, but he who sins sexually sins against his own body." (ICor.6:18). Our body is a temple of the Holy Spirit, and it is bought at a price. Moreover, once a man and a woman are joined in their marriage, they become one body and both are members of the body of Christ. Breaking a marriage therefore is also hurting the body of Christ. Then what should those who have already sinned against their own bodies and hurt the body of Christ do? The best option is for them to repent and sin no more before the judgment day of the Lord.

The Scripture says, "Since there is so much sexual immorality, each man should have his own wife, and each woman should have her own husband." (ICor.7:2) According to the Professor of Sociology in University of Chicago, Dr Edward Lauman's research, 18% of married women and 24% of married men in the United States today have extramarital affairs. Dr. Helen Fisher, an American anthropologist and human behavior researcher discovered

that among those who have committed adultery, 34% women and 56% men claimed that they have normal marriages. That is to say, many marriages today have been broken spiritually without the person's knowledge. To remedy such marriages, the guilty parties have to renounce their relationship with the other persons, then confess to their spouses and seek forgiveness for an appropriate reconciliation. Otherwise, their brokenness may hinder their prayers and they will not be able to be the joint heir of the grace of life even though they have not been divorced.

However, prevention is better than cure. It is imperative for the married couples to enrich their marital bond through consistent communication with each other and to seek to resolve their conflicts constructively. The process that leads to infidelity always begins innocently enough with the sharing of one's stress or unresolved spousal conflicts with colleagues or friends who are of the opposite sex. The attentive ears of the party concerned may be a draw for them to become soul mates and this may ultimately land the parties concerned in adulterous acts.

Therefore, it is of great advantage for couples to join a covenant family group which meets regularly as a means of helping one another resolve their conflicts as well as to enhance spousal communications. Couples will certainly have better sexual intimacy once they are able to communicate well with each other and resolve their conflicts effectively.

Forming covenant family groups for our course participants is our main goal for all the courses conducted by Oasis Family Life Enrichment Center. In fact it is a buffer for the influence of sexual immorality.



We wish all couples may fulfil their vows and flourish in love hand in hand and heart to heart throughout their marital journey.
